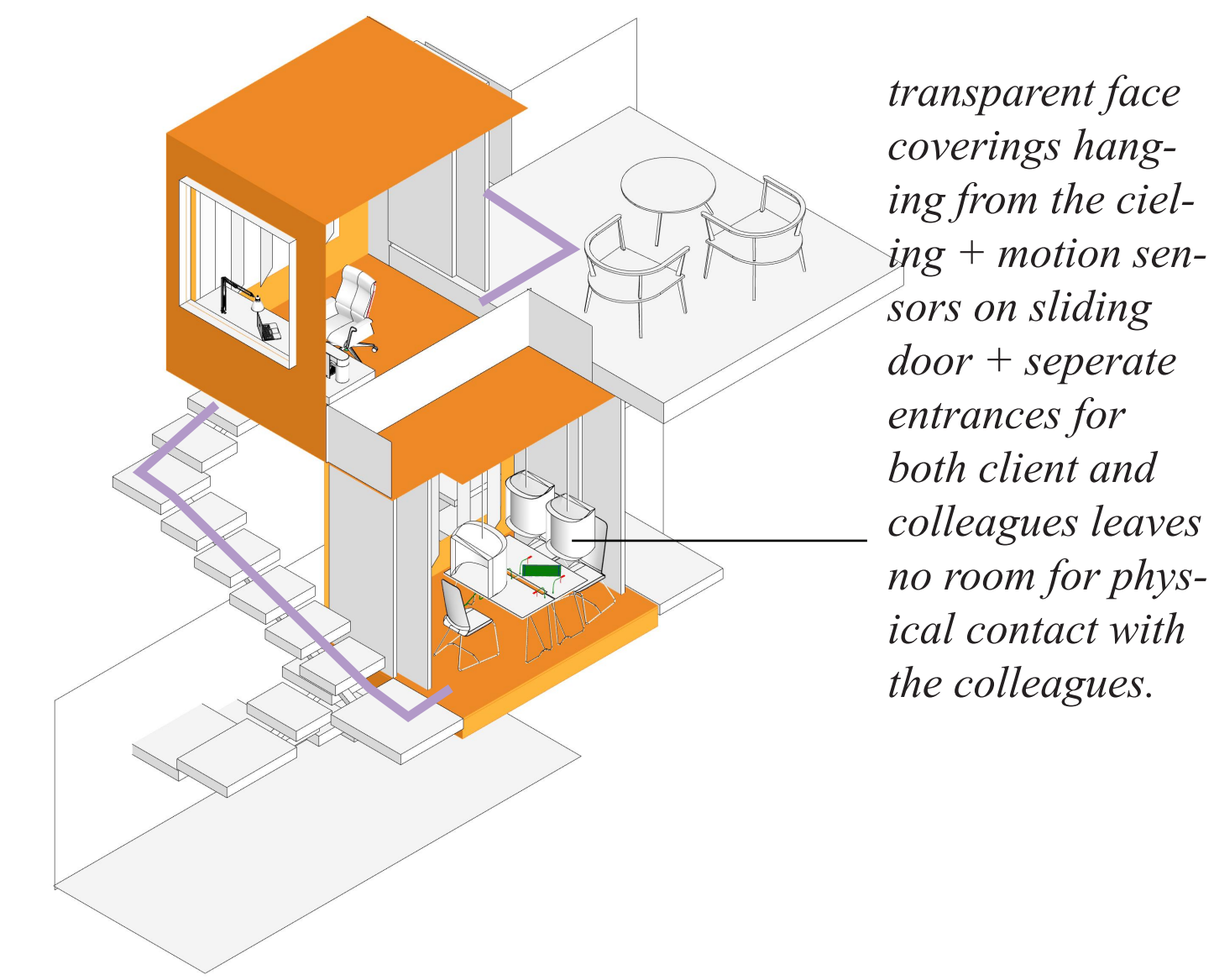
coffee machine, serves me(right across the terrace), my client, and the colleagues

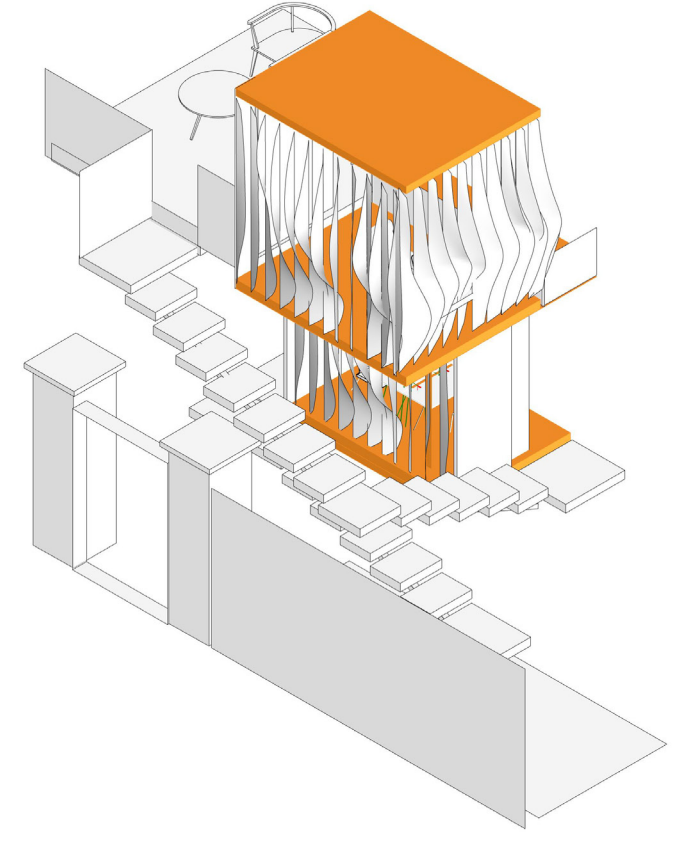
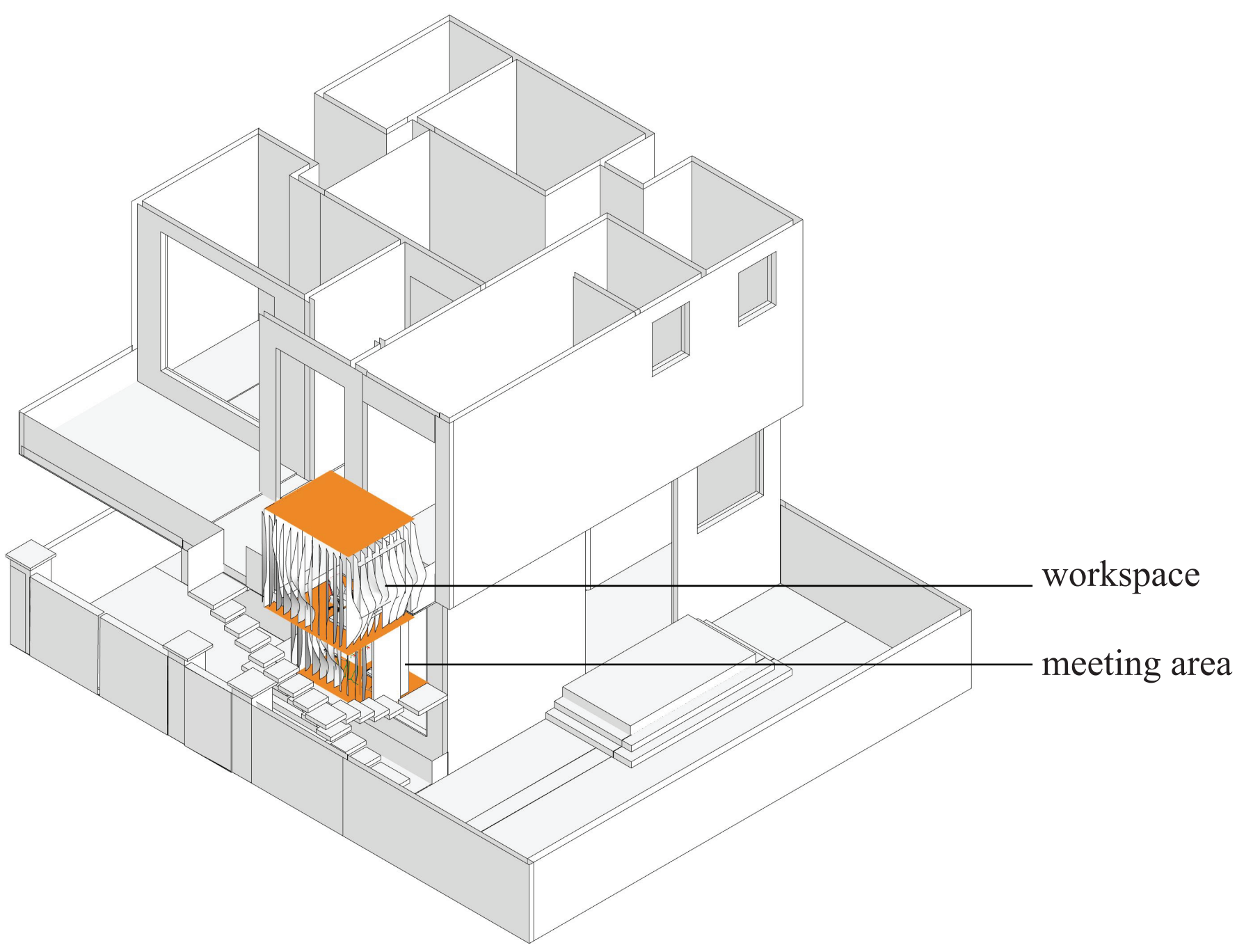
This workspace can also be used as my personal study space when client's working hours are over and the space is no longer used by him. The terrace of my room was not in use before since it was fully exposed to the street

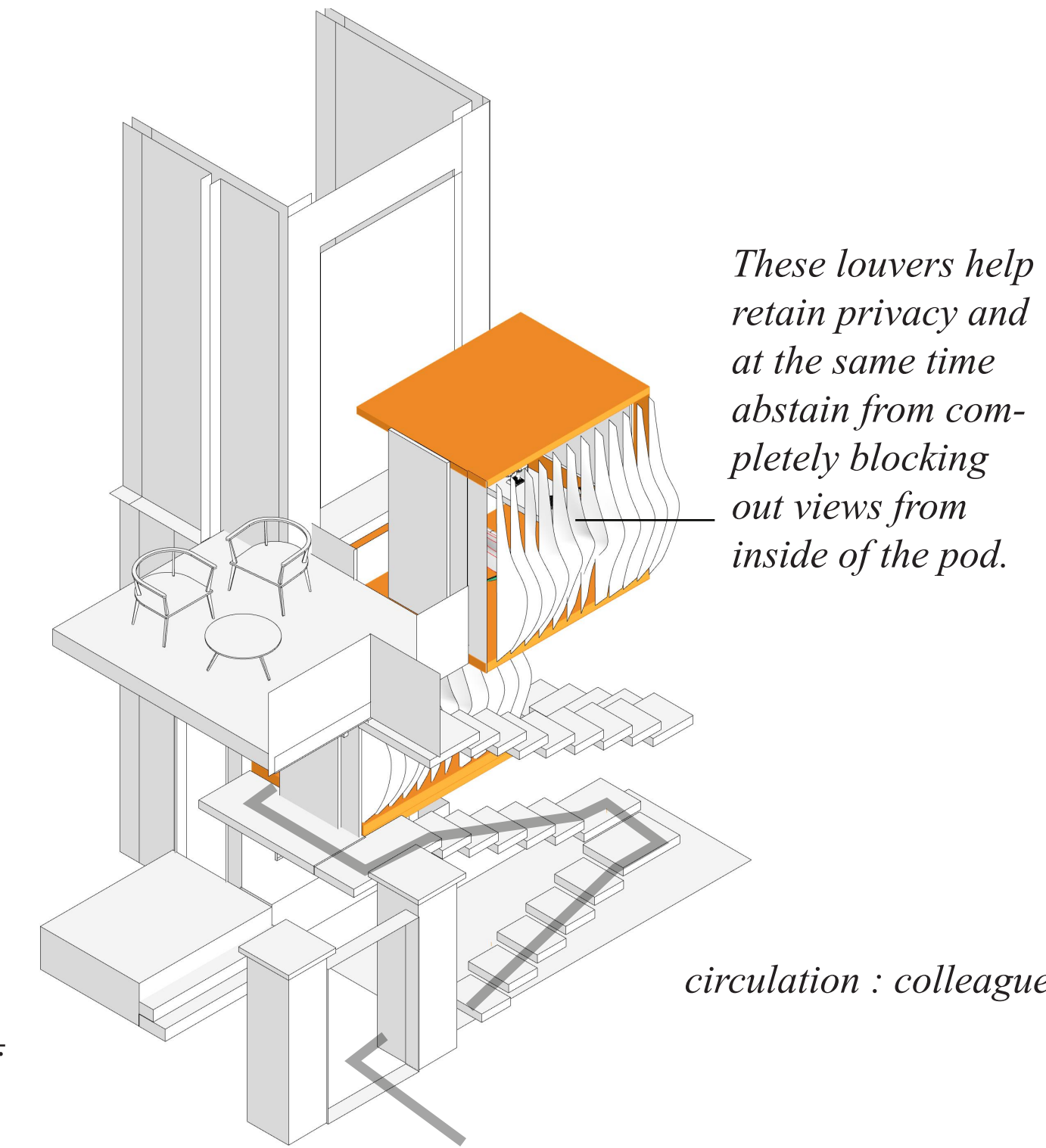


transparent face coverings hanging from the ceiling + motion sensors on sliding door + separate entrances for both client and colleagues leaves no room for physical contact with the colleagues.

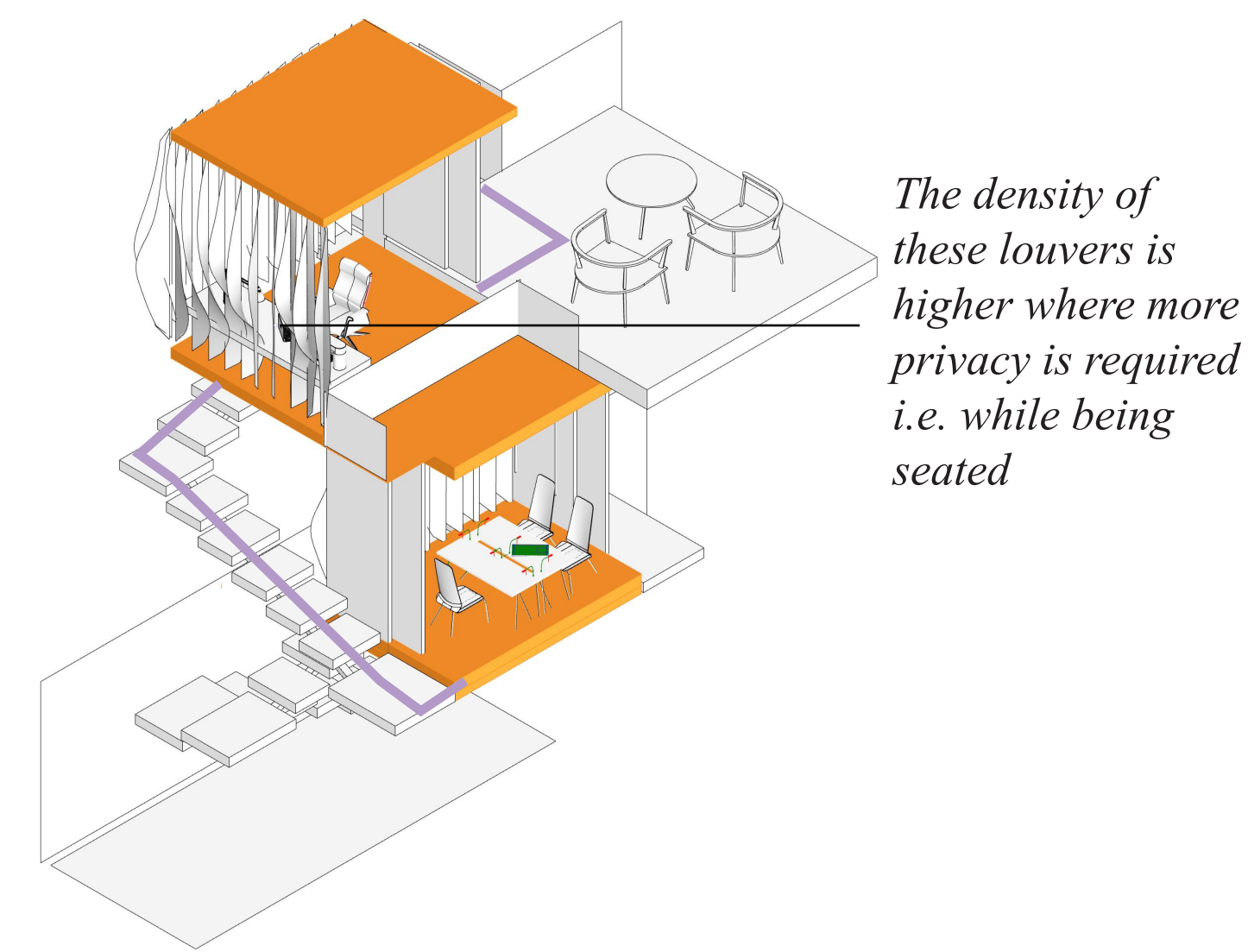

These louvers help retain privacy and at the same time abstain from completely blocking out views from inside of the pod.

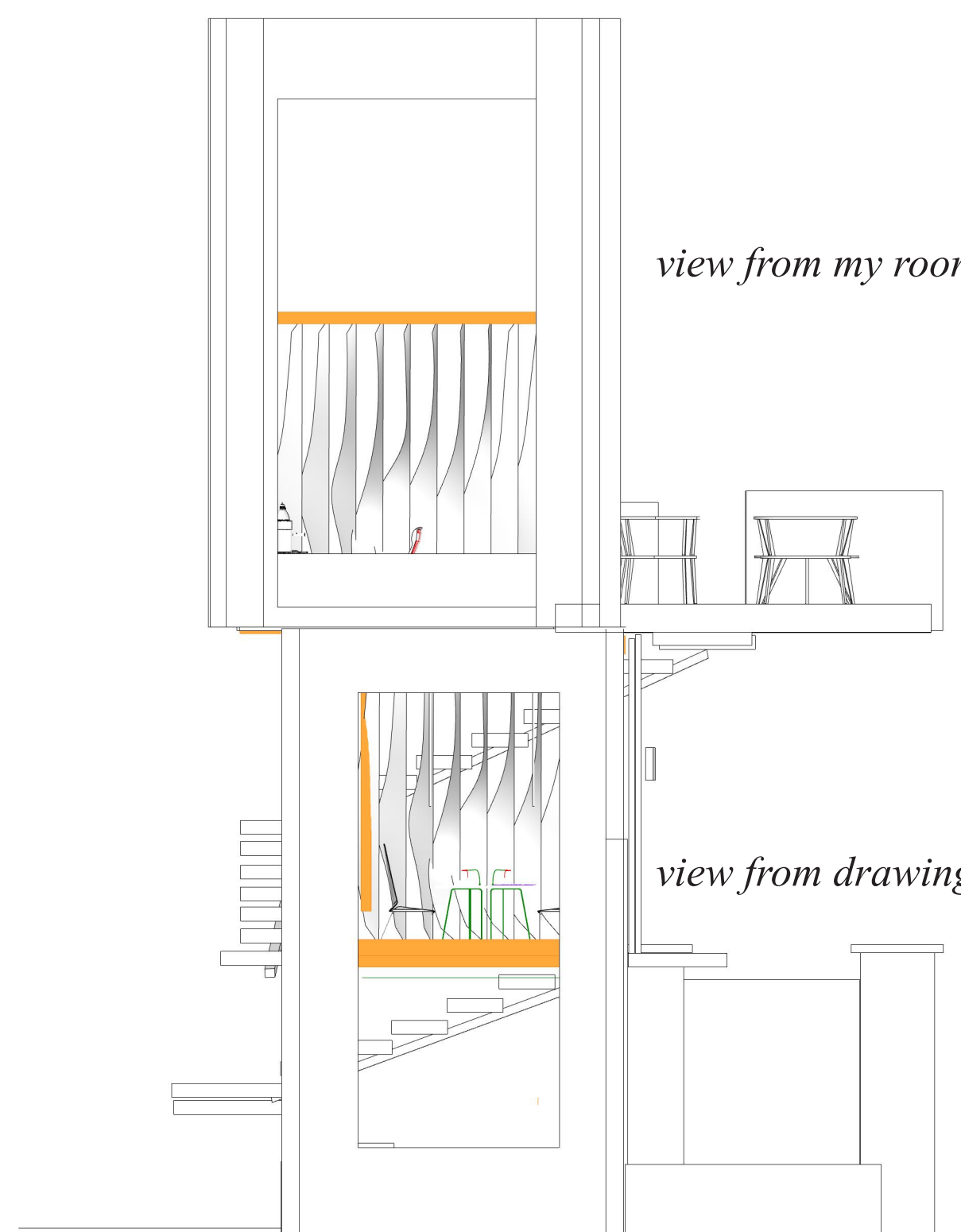
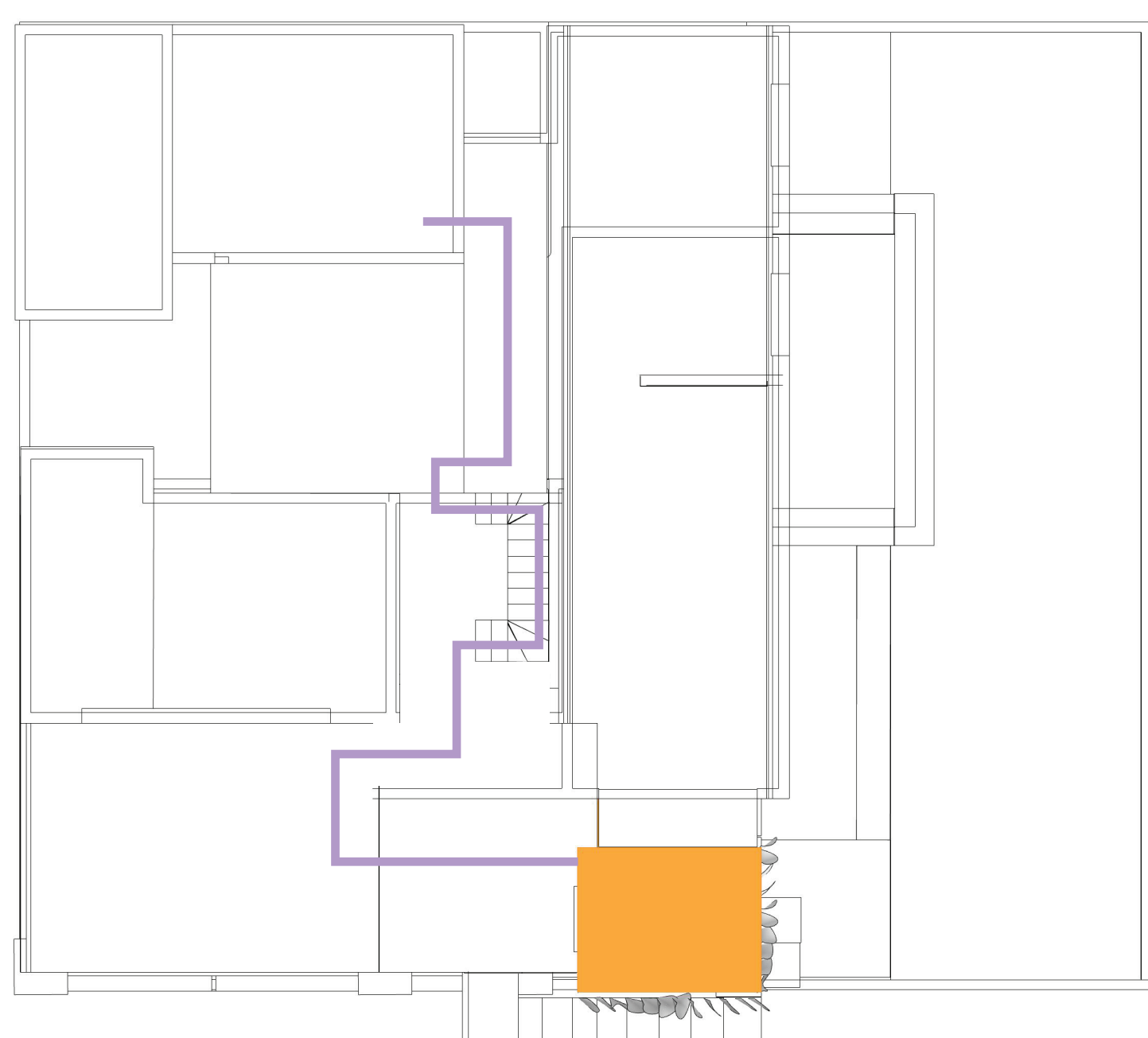
