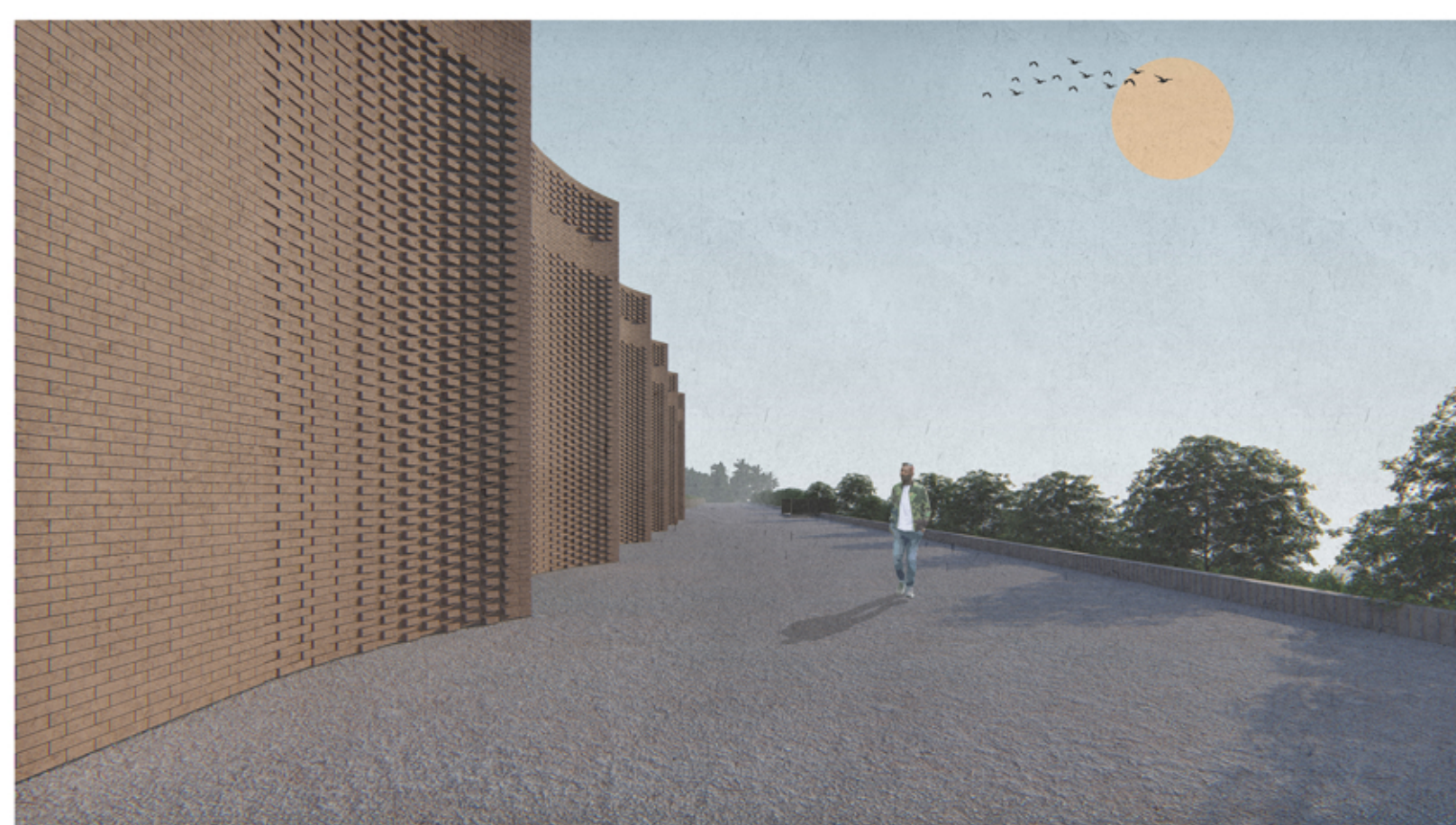


DEVELOPMENT OF MATTER ON THE BASIS OF A DISPOSAL ARRANGEMENT

WINERY IN BRATISLAVA

In Slovakia, interest in grape growing and wine production is increasing again. In recent years, the architecture of the vineyards has attracted attention in this area, which, in addition to classic winemakers, also attracts ordinary wine consumers. Architecture and vineyards are the perfect combination of enjoyment and art around the world.

The project focused on the Malokarpatska wine region in Bratislava in the Rača wine village. In the Brežok area, I designed a winery with a restaurant, local sales and accommodation in a pleasant environment of existing vineyards. I focused mainly on the winery building and I designed it as a massive, but not very flashy, building located above the city of Bratislava. The aim of this work is to raise awareness of the history of viticulture in Slovakia and its current depiction in our country and in the world. Such constructions are necessary so that the wine industry does not decline, but grow. Wine architecture has great potential to make wine tourism in Slovakia more attractive and bring it fame.

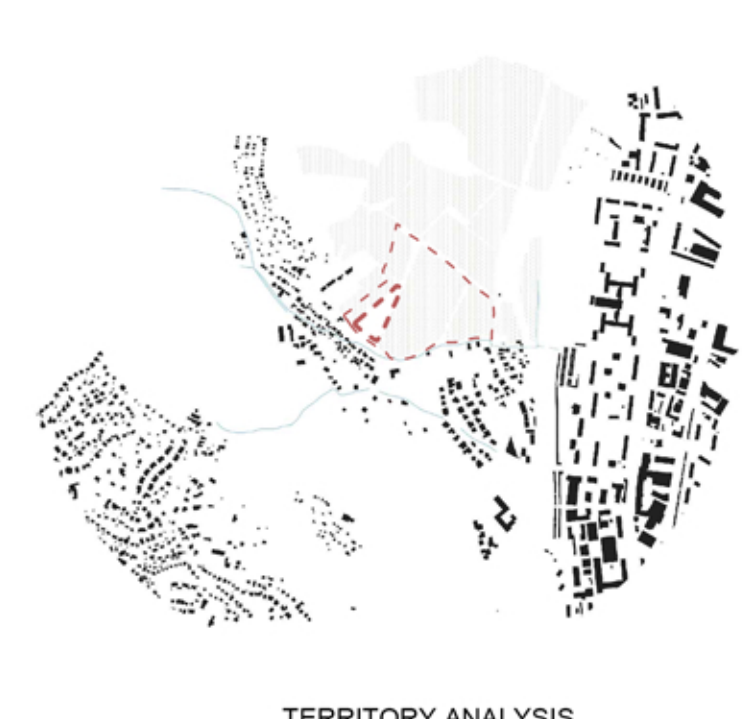
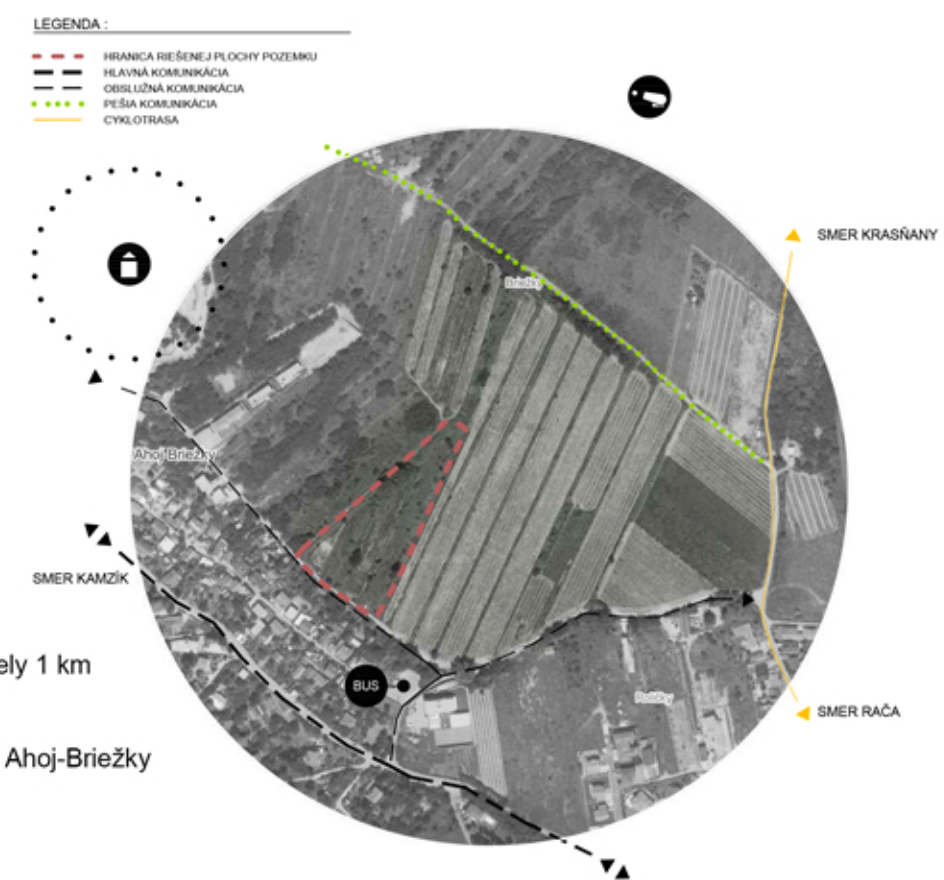
URBAN INTEGRATION INTO THE TERRITORY

The land is located in the city of Bratislava, in the cadastral area of Vinohrady and more specifically in the area of Brežky. The building is in close proximity from Račianská Street, which is approximately 1 km and within 200 m is the nearest public transport stop. The solved winery building with a restaurant is located on a rather sloping plot with an area of approximately 92 hectares with existing terraced vineyards. The winery with a restaurant is situated in the highest point of the land, on the west side, close to the access road. Thanks to its location at the highest point, the building has an unobstructed view of the surrounding vineyards and the panorama of the city of Bratislava. In the immediate vicinity is the residential area Ahoj-Brežky also with the ongoing new construction of family houses towards the chamois. There is also an old artillery cavern and a former quarry. There are also a few smaller family wineries in the area. The proposal also includes exterior interventions, both for the creation of parking areas and roads, as well as also on recreational areas for visitors. All the surrounding landscaping, as well as the winery itself, are designed in accordance with the surrounding nature and landscape.

LITTLE CARPATHIAN WINE AREA

Slovakia is divided into 6 wine-growing areas, 40 wine-growing districts and 603 wine-growing municipalities. We know the East Slovakia, Tokaj, Central Slovakia, Nitra, South Slovakia and Lesser Carpathians. Our project is located in the Lesser Carpathian region in the Bratislava wine-growing district. The Bratislava district is divided into 5 wine-growing municipalities of category B1. Devín, Karlová Ves, Nové Mesto, Rača and Vajnory. My winery design is located in the village of Rača.

The Malokarpatská vinohradnícka oblasť is located in the southwestern part of Slovakia and consists of three sub-areas, which differ from each other in terms of climatic, but especially soil-geological conditions. The vineyards are located on the southwestern slopes of the Little Carpathians from Bratislava to Horné Orešany. The southwestern slopes of this mountain range represent a real jewel of viticulture in Slovakia. The history of viticulture and winemaking in this area dates back to 1948 when the counties and their traditional wine-growing areas replaced by regional, district and local district authorities. It was a long century ago. The Bratislava wine-growing region is the most important in our country. The names of the Little Carpathian wine towns and villages have the best sound among wine lovers and experts. In terms of reputation, the Yugoslav region can be equal today.
