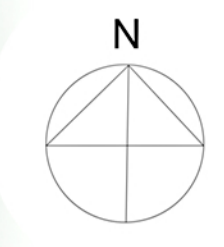
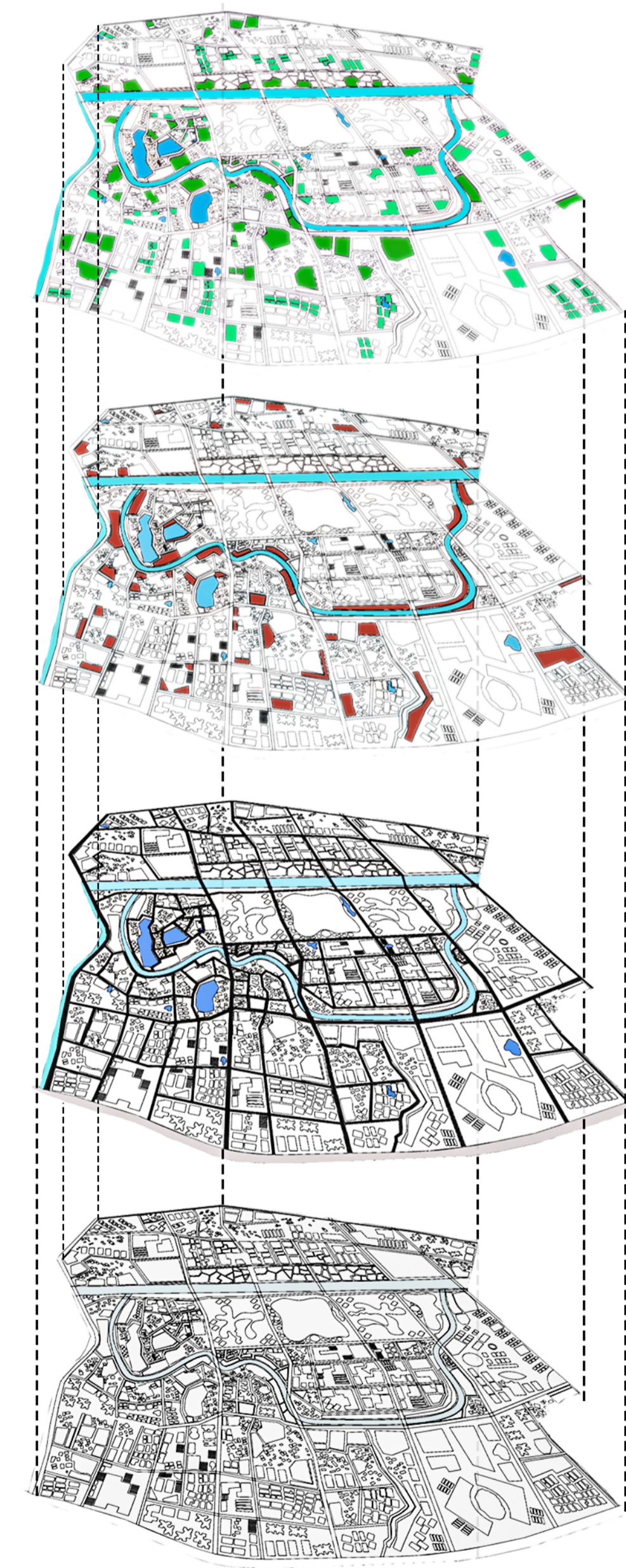
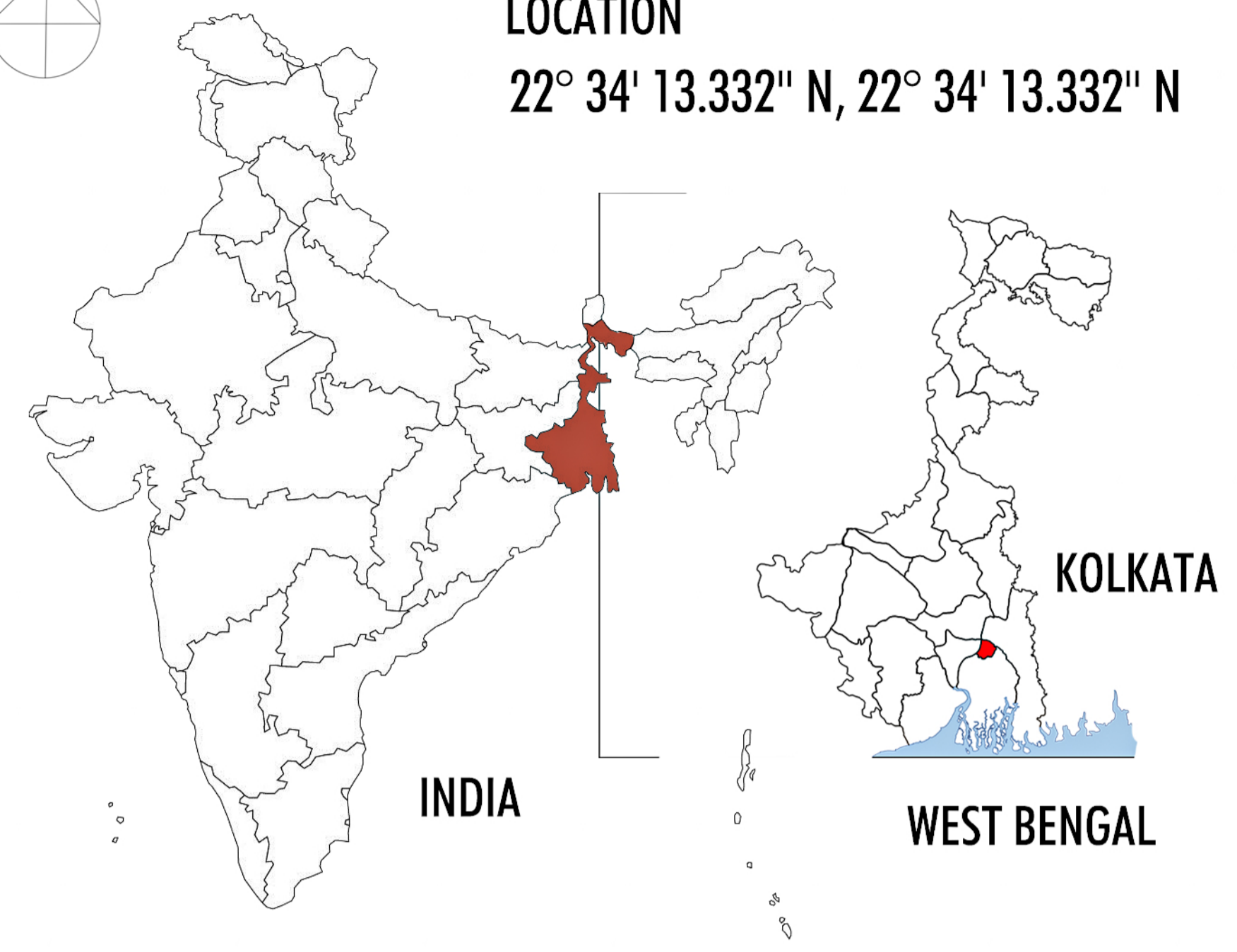

DEVELOPED LAND USE PATTERN

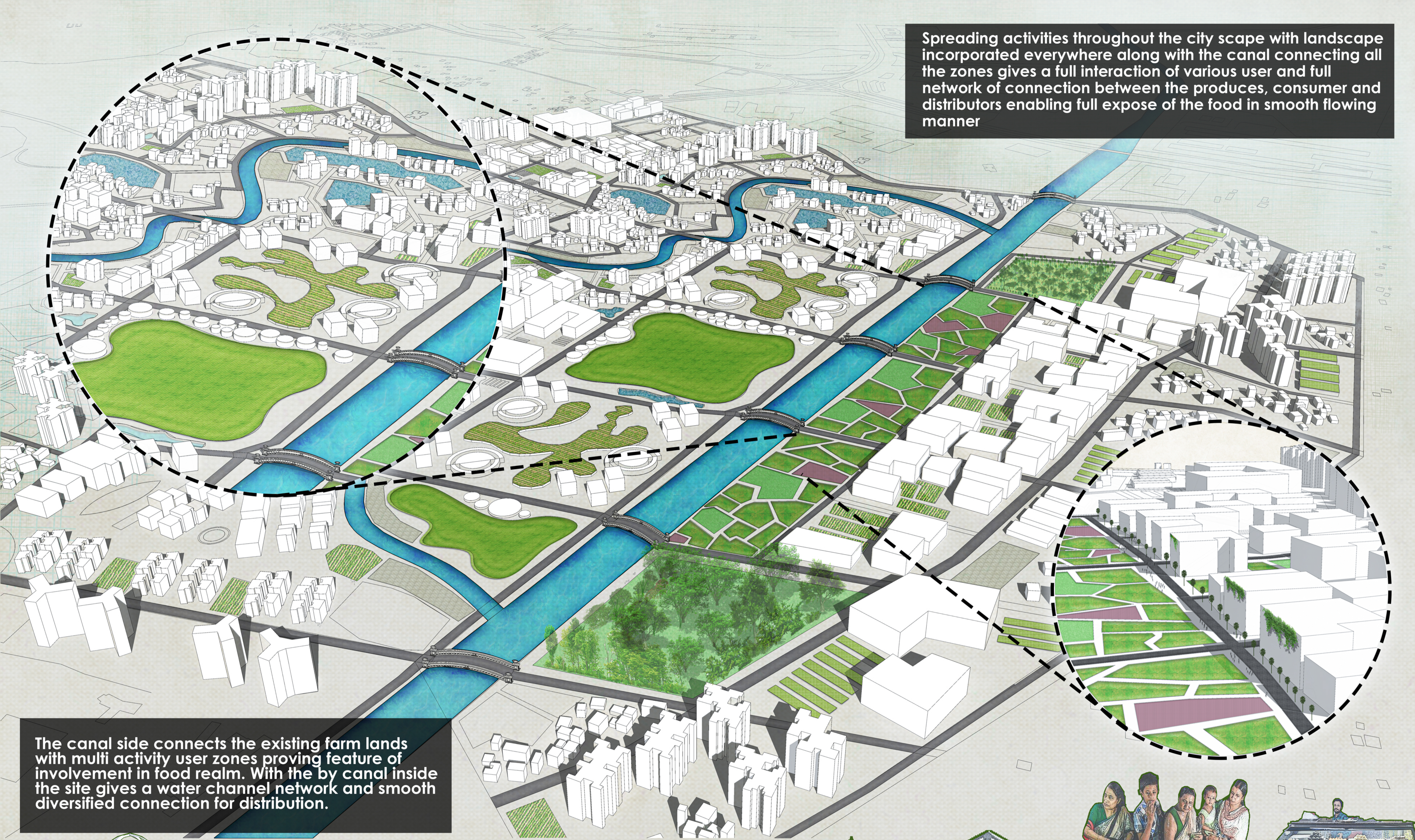
