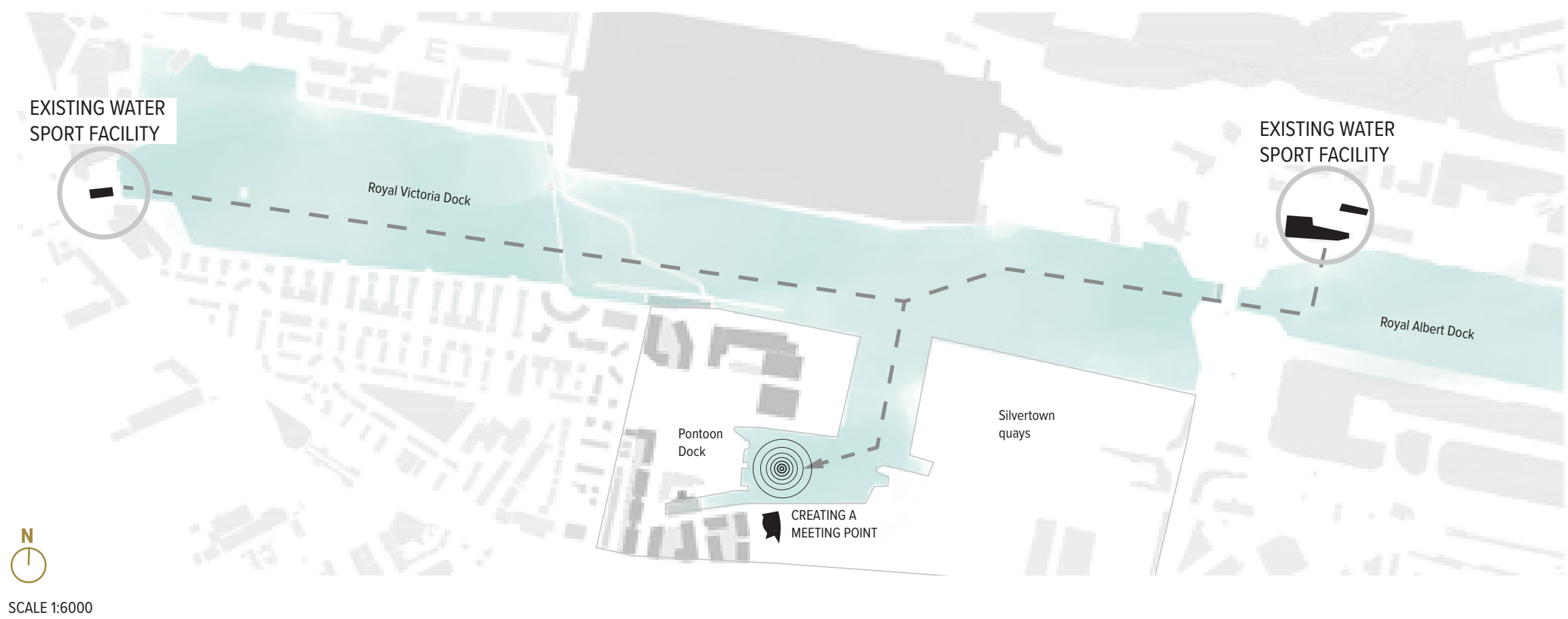

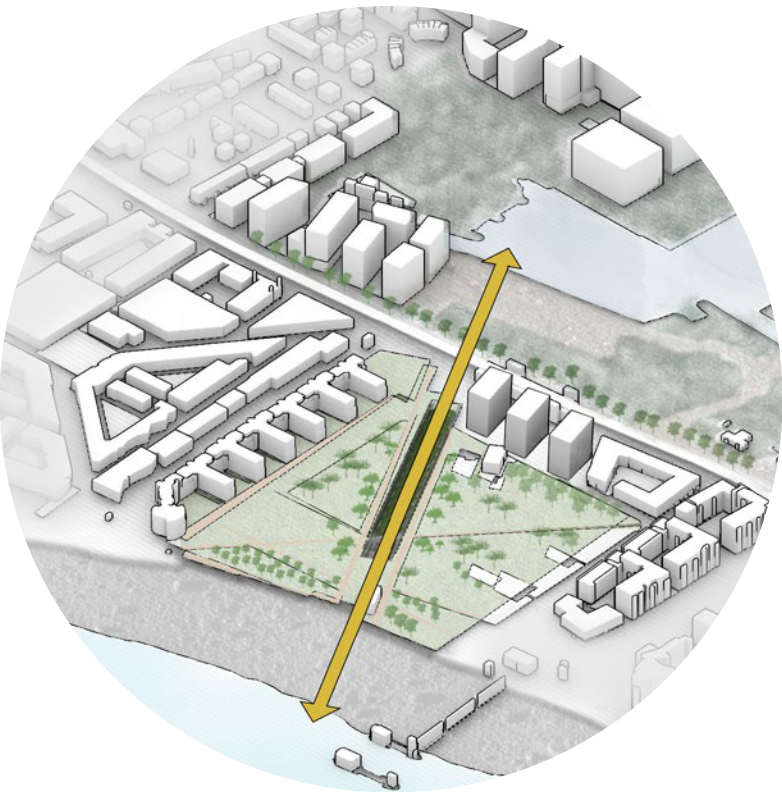
A performing stage on the water, reactivating the Docks and the community

CREATING A PLACE WHERE EVERYONE CAN MEET



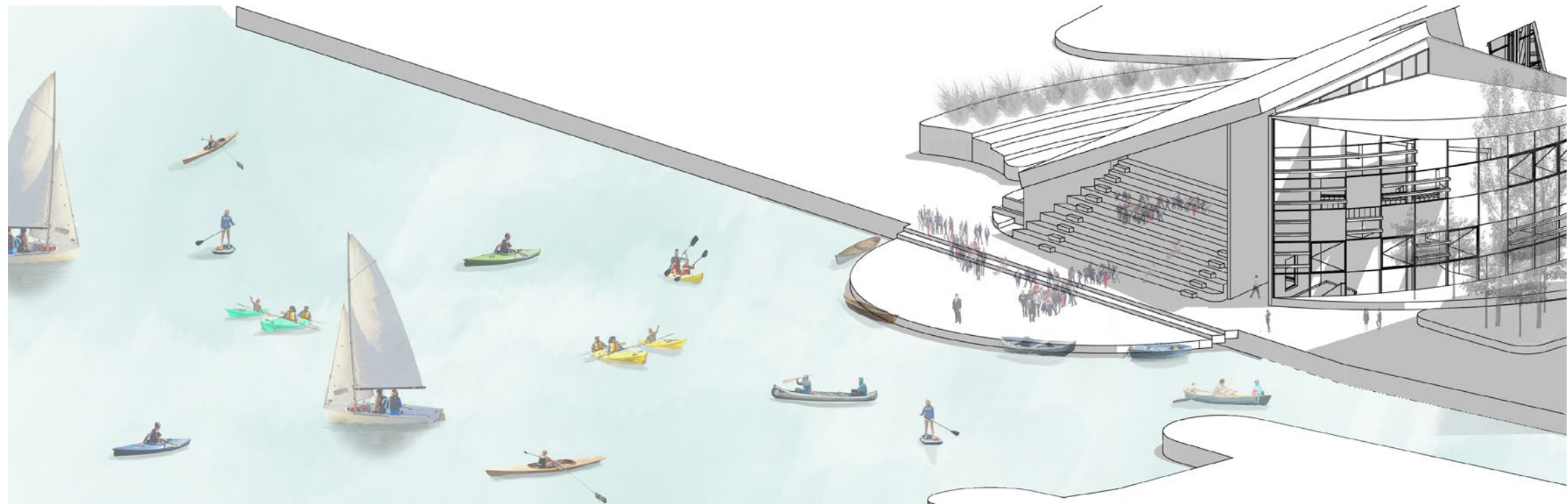

ADMIRING THE DOCKS LIKE IN A THEATRE

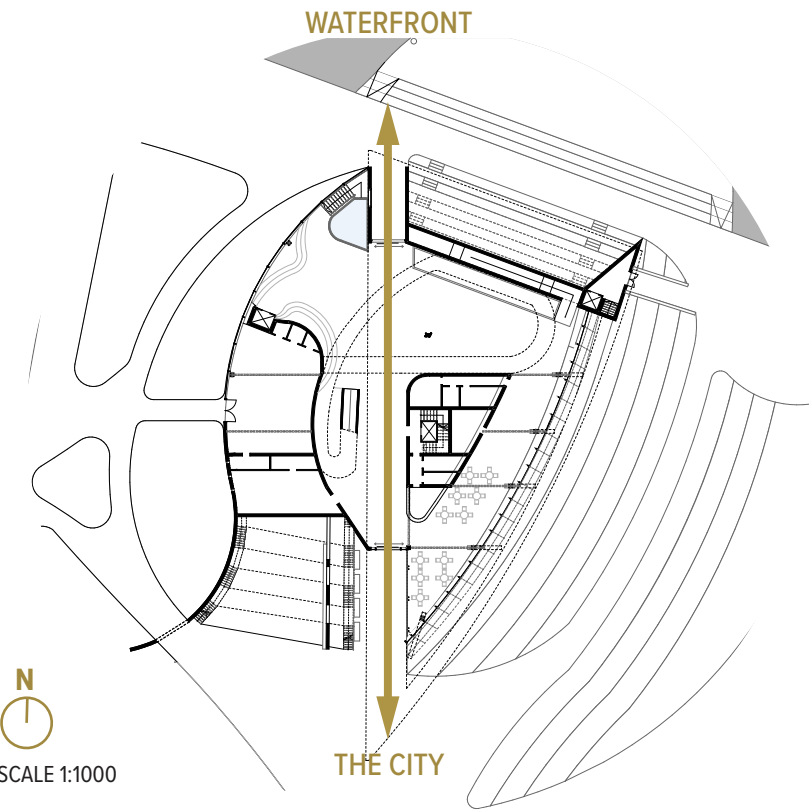


Sport activities present in the Royal Docks include:
