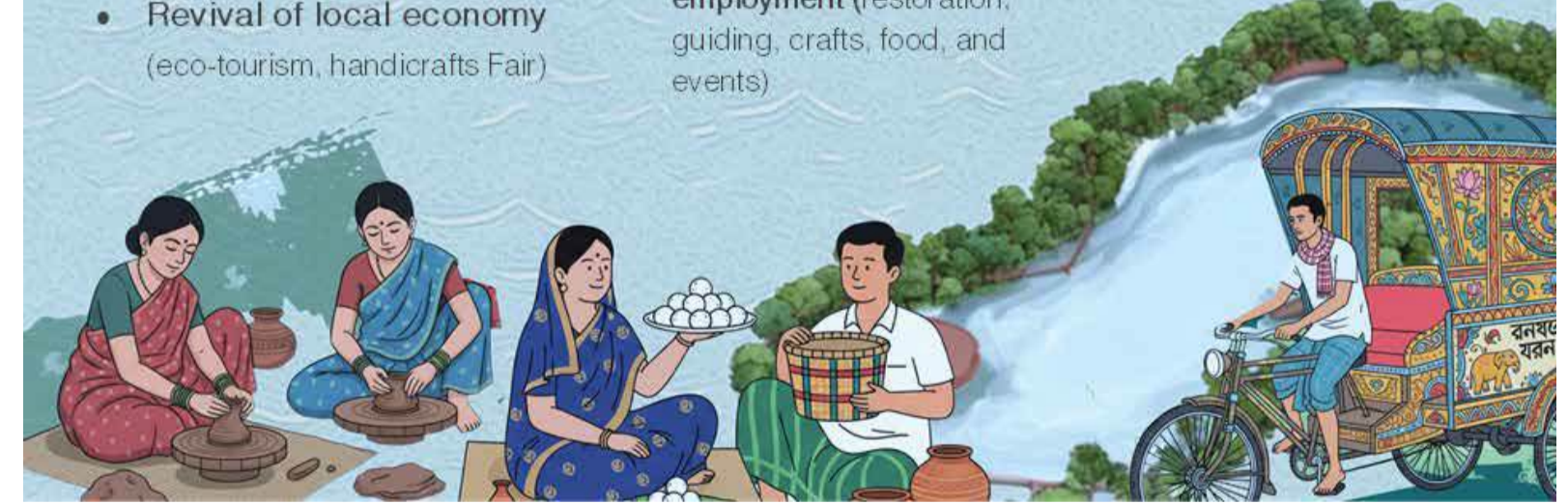
National and Int'l Level SDG 2030
